Young Reformers Network

- The program of Young Reformers Network aims to build a strong network among young people and offer meaningful contributions for the Lutheran churches.
- It will be built by young Lutherans within the context of reformatory heritage, Lutheran identity and today's global connectivity.
- The LWF and its member churches provide space for young people to name problems they see, to share their dreams and hopes and to take up today's challenges from a perspective of the Reformation.



Expected outcomes of the Young Reformers Network

- 175 young leaders from all member churches of the LWF have been empowered to work for Reformation in their churches and societies
- 175 congregations, parishes and youth groups have experienced aspects of Reform
- A wider group of 10 000 young people has contributed to the process and received meaningful insights for their own engagement
- The global dimension of the Reformation gets visible on a global level and in the places of Reformation



- Ideas of young Lutherans are developed and accompanied in their follow up
- The Global Young Reformers Network provides meaningful and clear contribution to Lutheran theology
- The Global Young Reformers Network gives a major contribution to the 2017 Reformation Anniversary program and to the LWF Assembly in 2017
- Training of new technologies as a working tool is provided to support sustainable, eco effective and modern communication.

- Lutheran-Catholic dialogue: From Conflict to Communion; joint liturgical materials for commemorating the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation
- > LWF Task Force on Mennonite Action
- Joint preparations for 2017 with Anglicans and the Reformed
- Participating in the Faith and Order process on renewal in the life of the church





Study processes on Lutheran Hermeneutics and Religion and Development

Main aim: to continue to articulate what it means to be Lutheran today through deepening the understanding of the gospel and the confessional writings

- To analyse the mutual relationship between context, text and tradition: how do we read our own contexts; how do we read our own tradition; how do we relate it to our identity.
- What constitutes the authoritative Lutheran texts? How are they to be understood today?
- Which socio-economic changes have been envoked by the Reformation?



Interreligious dialogues

- Public space and citizenship as important concepts in plural societies for negotiating questions of justice and peace. The role of religions in society as well as the legal framework for religious life.
- Reform and renewal in Jewish, Christian and Muslim tradition. Theological understandings of religious transformation and the impact of current religious renewal processes on interfaith relations.
